A little more about Coach Todd -

Todd has been the head coach for the Saline High School swim and dive teams since 2007. He coaches both the girl's and the boy's teams for our high school. Todd previously coached at Club Wolverine, Saline Middle School Swim & Dive Team, Huron Valley Swim Club, Ann Arbor Country Club and Dexter High School. He coached the Dexter High School boy's team to a State Championship in 1999. For the 2008-09 and 2009-10 girl's season, Todd was named the Coach of the Year for MISCA zone 4. Todd coached the Saline High School girl's swim team to their first ever state championship in 2009 and 2010. He has coached the boy's swim team to four consecutive state titles. Todd was also named the MISCA Boy's Swim Coach of the Year in 2009-2010. As a swimmer, Todd excelled in the breaststroke. Todd swam for EMU in the late 1980's and early 1990's, where his team were MAC champions each year. He was a NCAA Division 1 qualifier, held MAC championship titles in the 100 breaststroke, 200 breaststroke, 800 free relay, 200 free relay, and 400 medley relay. Todd continues to be among EMU's elite swimmers, remaining in tile top ten fastest for the 100 and 200 breaststroke, 800 free relay, 200 and 400 medley relay. Todd teaches the sixth grade at Saline Middle School.
